The Year of Young People 2018 (YoYP 2018) has been co-designed with young people right from the very beginning and co-design is central to all aspects of the year.

Preparation work started over two years ago, and young people have been co-designing their year with partners since then. Everything from the year's six themes to the logo and website were co-designed with young people, and we want to ensure that co-design continues throughout partner's planning and preparation of their activities. This document is aimed at event organisers and should be read alongside the Co-design Blueprint. It highlights some key things that you might not have considered for example the Young Scot Card, working with key organisations, safeguarding young people and the UNCRC.

## Planning for your event with young people

### A Co-design Blueprint

Young people have worked with Children in Scotland, Scottish Youth Parliament and Young Scot to develop 'A Co-design Blueprint'. The Blueprint is a ten-point guide for any partner which sets out young people's expectations of their year and how they should be involved. The Blueprint has been endorsed by The Scottish Government's Themed Years Team and should be strictly adhered to.
